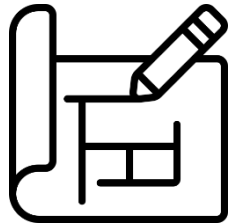

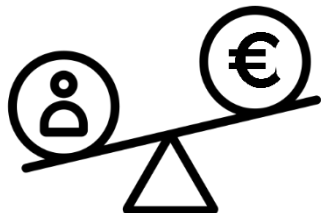


Apply EE1st in planning, policy and major investment decisions* in energy systems & non-energy sectors with significant impact on energy consumption

* more than €100 million each and €175 million for transport infrastructure



Monitor the application of EE1st (identify a monitoring entity or entities)



Promote and apply cost-benefit methodologies (wider benefits of energy efficiency, societal perspective)

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Subject of reporting /obligation	Deadline	Recurrence (if yes, how frequent)	Type of reporting (governance, NCPRs, transposition)	IT tool and IT development needed
How the energy efficiency first principle was taken into account in the national and, where applicable, regional and local planning, policy and major investment decisions related to the national and regional energy systems	First NECPR after the transposition (March 2027)	NECPRs: every two years	NECPRs	Reporting via already existing e-platform (Reportnet)
